

Goose Creek

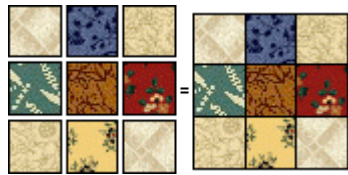
This makes a 12" block, and is another GREAT one for beginners...or anyone who wants to make a quilt in a hurry! :o)



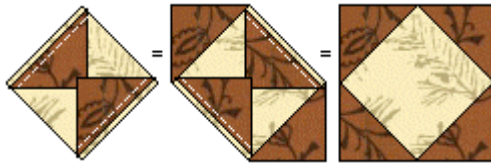
Think Scrappy!
Have fun with the colors..
Just use the same for the center squares as you do for the 4 corners

** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block

Use the same material for the outside 4 corners on the nine patch as you use for the center of the Triangle square



Start by cutting 8. 2 1/2" squares for the outside corners then cut 2 2 1/2 "squares from 5 different. material as shown. Make TWO nine patch blocks as shown at left, using all scant 1/4" seams. Press row seams in alternating directions. These should measure 6-1/2" when done, trim them if needed...



Cut two different materials 3-7/8" squares of "dark" fabric, Cut these from point to point to make 4 triangles. Cut a square 4-3/4" from the same material as the corner above. Press seams towards outer triangles. Make 2 -6 1/2"

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Now just piece the block! Make rows, then sew the rows together, again using scant 1/4" seams. Press row seams in alternating directions. All Done! :o)

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
