Block of The Month

Pinwheel

Fabric provided: 2 - 4" print squares

Fabric you provide: 2-4" squares of solid colored fabric taken from print provided, i.e., pink, orange, green, teal, lavender, etc.

For the half-square triangles match the 4" solid fabric to the 4" print fabric provided. Trim the half square triangle to 3.5" if necessary. Press seams open.

Arrange the units as shown in the photo, being sure the orientation of the triangle is the same. The final block should measure 6.5 inches.
