

Round/Strip Robins

We had a discussion at our last meeting and I think that it's great if we go forward with it. I am willing to set up the lists and pass these out each month. Please read below.

For one of our fundraisers we would like to make some Round Robin and Row/Strip Robin quilts. If you are interested in making one of these fabulous starter squares/row quilts, here is the criteria of what we are asking for.

For the Round Robin, make some kind of square that is at least 12" square. It could be a panel that you add a border around or it can be a pieced square.

For the Strips Robin, we would like them to be at least 5" X 18". Once again this can be a small panel that you add fabric to. It can be wider than 5" but must be 18" long. You can provide extra fabric to go with them for the next person to use.



We would like to have these at the February meeting. We will then write your name down at the top of the sheet and each person who takes one will also have their name written down for each quilt they add to. At this point we are still working on how we will distribute these when they are done. A few options are:

- 1. A live auction for each quilt.
- 2. We buy tickets and you put tickets in the basket for the one that you would like to win. If you worked on the quilt you get so many free tickets. (TBD)

Each month we will look at each one and see who would like to take it and then when we feel that it is finished, we will then need someone to quilt and bind them which will count as part of working on that quilt.
