Minutes of the November 1, 2016 PQG General Meeting

Call to Order: Co-President Jayne M. called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

Next Board Meeting – Monday, November 28, 2016 @ St. John's Episcopal Church, in the church library.

New Members and Guests -

There were neither new members nor guests to report.

Treasurer's Report - Ruth M. reported the balance in the PQG treasury and noted that Walker Creek had been paid.

Voting on the proposed budget was deferred due to lack of a quorum.

Business – Jayne M. reported that the cost to rent a halfroom in the Community Center for meetings would be approximately \$100/meeting less than the \$189/meeting the guild will have to pay effective January 1, 2017 for the whole room. The preferred side would be the one with the kitchen. The whole room could be rented for special events as needed. This is one way to address budget concerns over the continuously increasing rate for Community Center space

which members were asked to consider prior to the budget vote now scheduled for December.

Committee Reports

Block of the Month – Melissa R. showed a Flying Geese block. Participants should see her for additional information.

Fat Quarter Frenzy – Sue D., winner of the November Fat Quarter Frenzy, selected winter colors for the December meeting.

Friendship Appliqué – Barbara C. reported that no new patterns have been submitted and asked members to consider submitting some.

Friendship Pieced – Shannon W. has six blocks available and one new one from Brenda B.

Half Square Triangle Block –

Melissa R. showed an hourglass block for which she will email instructions to participants.

Hospitality – Jayne M. asked for two volunteers to fill the Hospitality opening.

Library – Kitty T. has volunteered; thank you! Kitty reported that the guild has a very nice collection of books.

Cards to check them out/in are located in the small wooden box. A red binder catalogues all guild owned books by the guild by type of quilting. Check it out.

Military Quilts - Jayne M. reported that for now, all fabric will be provided for military quilts due to a recent donation. Opportunity Quilts - Kitty T. reported that the long-arm quilter has nearly completed her work with the black and white quilt; binding and final appliqué are still needed. This quilt will be unveiled to members in December and raffle tickets will be available beginning in January. The single Irish chain quilt is in progress. Parliamentarian – This position is still open.

Quilts for Cots - Ellie O. reported that 12 children's guilts and 12 children's pillow cases were delivered last week. More packets are available. Tri-Guild Luncheon 2017 -Metha S. described preparation and luncheon activities for members who have not attended a Tri-Guild Luncheon before. The committee is asking for volunteers to act as table hostesses; Barbara C. will coordinate them. Meg M. is working on table centerpieces. Many hands are needed to host a successful event for 150 guests so please contact Metha about what you can do to help. This event is the largest guild fund-raiser planned for 2017. bring a dozen fabric strips measuring 2 ½ inches by the width of the fabric to ante with.

Minutes of the November 28, 2016 PQG Board Meeting

Board Members Present: Jayne M., Garnet W., Gloria K., Ruth M., Sue D. and Kathy B.

Board Members Absent: None.

Others Present: Members Metha S. and Ellie O.

Call to Order: Garnet called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

Approval of Minutes: Motion/second/call – Jayne/Ruth/All to approve minutes of the October 23, 2016 Board Meeting as read in the newsletter

Treasurer's Report and Budget: Ruth gave the Treasurer's Report. At present, projected budget expenses exceed revenues from membership dues. The budget is based on:

- Eighty paid memberships current membership at 72 with 5 new more pending. If membership remains the same, a membership drive and/ or more fundraising need to be considered. Our annual dues are inline with other similar organizations but we have a smaller group.
- Revenues from the quilt show have been thinned to cover the three year period between shows as voted by the membership.
- Meeting room rental expense is higher each year, considerably. Jayne discussed options with members at the November general meeting. The present, centrally located Community Center is ideal in many ways but the guild might reduce its space requirements for routine general meetings to save money and retain the larger space for specific events. Other venues, while costing less, do not deliver in areas such as location, well lighted

- parking, set up and tear down before/after each meeting or kitchen amenities.
- The guild has fixed expenses.
 Without further adjustments to balance the budget and eliminate the deficit, the program category will likely be affected most.

Due to lack of a quorum for voting in November, Ruth will email the proposed budget to members prior to the December general meeting with a planned vote at the meeting to bring the budgeting process to conclusion.

Membership Report: Gloria reported current membership at 72 with 5 new memberships pending.

Programs Report/Workshops: Sue needs volunteers for January's program. Persons are needed [for a five minute presentation each] to share three of their own quilts and tell the quilts' stories. Information about December's auction and potluck are highlighted in the December newsletter.

Treasurer's Audit: No report.

Business: Jayne reported that Laura L. has volunteered to chair Hospitality. Thank you Laura! There will be no Board meeting in December. Metha S. reported that miscellaneous items are still needed for basket completion for the Tri-Guild Luncheon.

Next Board Meeting: Monday, January 30 at 6:30 PM at St. John's Episcopal Church in the library. All are welcome.

It is time again to get away and do some sewing....Here is the main information. Our retreat will take place on Feb. 17, 18 and 19 at Walker Creek Ranch, 14 miles out of Petaluma. We sew in a large well lit room on many long tables and we stay overnight in semi private rooms. That means there are 2 - 3 twin beds to a room, in a building that can accommodate 19 overnight. They cook all our food, and do the dishes too!

We start our weekend at 2 PM setting up, with Dinner at 6 on Friday. We have 3 meals on Saturday; Breakfast is at 8 AM, Lunch at 12, and Dinner at 6. On Sunday, we have Breakfast at 8, Lunch at 12 and leave at 3 PM. You are welcome to stay the whole weekend or you can just pick a certain time to come.

When we are not eating, we are busy at our machines creating some wonderful quilts, or other creative pieces. We love to sew, talk, learn, and sew some more! If any of this sounds interesting to you, the cost is the following:

Full time: \$249

Breakfast: \$12 Lunch: \$14 Dinner: \$18 Lodging: \$82 per night

Day Use: \$17 (You must pay this if you are NOT spending the night)

Keeping watch as the numbers grow, Ellie shared that COTS has distributed over 3,200 quilts since 1993. Fat Quarter Frenzy -Nancy L., December's FQF winner, selected blue for January's colors. Friendship Appliqué -Barbara C. thanked participants for the chicken blocks which she made into a gift. Friendship Pieced -Blocks are available.
