interest in sewing began at an early age; on the farm, making was a necessity.

Self-taught techniques and eventually U Tube and Facebook increased her skills and contacts with other quilters immeasurably. Besides a trunk show spanning her earliest to most recent quilts and more, Inger passed on several tips:

- A soak in Dawn and warm water removes color runs.
- Save your fabric dye recipe in case you need to match the color later.
- Design a simple book with examples of each embroidery stitch on your sewing machine to make it

easier to choose the best stitch to use.

- Use a new rotary blade when sewing with silk.
- Quilting time should equal piecing time.
- Don't let someone else stop you from trying; even mistakes teach us something. Keep on making.

Inger's positive approach was evident each time she said, "I had a lot of fun!"
Thank you, Inger, for a most memorable evening.


Committee for By-Laws Review/Revision – No report.


