Program – Eight members brought three quilts each to share: Sara Z., Susan H., Fran Z., Barbara C., Kirsten S., Kathy M. and Marilyn K. jointly, and Sue D. The variety of quilts and one album featuring the use of photos on fabric was inspiring as we begin the New Year. There were first/ latest quilts to show quilters' progress over time, a quilt of hand-dyed fabric, examples of round-robins featuring embroidery and appliqué, angel and cathedral window quilts, a quilt begun in 1931 and finished by a family member in recent years, quilts with wonderful detail, quilts for grandchildren, scrap quilts, quilts with layers and layers of small pieces and a quilt using fabrics by Kaffe Fassett.

Barbara C. noted that she has completed twelve quilts of nature found in Helen Putnam Park, which may develop into a local gallery show for public viewing; more to come on that.

A local speaker is scheduled in February. Watch for the next newsletter.




