


Sew Much News

A Comparison Chart - 1949 vs 2018


(Follow the numbers back and forth from column to column)

Many thanks to all of you who took one or more blocks for the quilt we are making for a fellow county resident who lost her home in the October fires. I was so pleased that over 40 blocks were signed out at the January meeting. If you did not return your block(s) at the February meeting, please bring them to the March meeting so we can move forward.

Our March meeting is dedicated to Outreach Sewing, and I will have the next steps prepped for then. We will be using the quiltas-you-go technique to make a reversible quilt, one side being bright, colorful and cheerful and the other side peaceful and calm, in blues and greens. There will be something for everyone: simple piecing, appliqué, or quilting on a sandwiched block, so bring your machine to the March meeting and let's make some progress on this quilt! I will bring a couple extra machines in case any one doesn't want to lug their machine in. Handwork is also an option. Of course, you can take blocks home, do them there and return them at the April meeting as well.

We are looking for Fabric that are at least 5 x 7 inches Each packet will have a variety of different fabrics.

We need the following type of fabrics to be cut. 30's reproductions, Polka Dots, Fall colors, Flower material (small prints), Solids, Retro Flowers (60's bold fabric) and Bright colors.

If you have NEW steam-aseam we could use this to put on the back.

The Machine will be at the March meeting and hope to start cutting them but will continue to make packets as we get fabric. Thank you.



Goodies Wanted For The Boutique




