Call to Order - Garnet called the meeting to order at 6:32 PM.

Membership Report -Gloria reported current membership at eighty seven. An updated membership roster was requested from Gloria. She

affiliates around August 15 regarding dues for the new fiscal year beginning September 1.

Programs Report/
Workshops – Sue reported that there will be speakers at both the August and September meetings plus a silent auction in September. Sally A. will prepare auction forms. Members will be asked to bring their auction items to that general meeting.

Business

Donation Button on the POG Website - POG member, Shannon W. S., recommended Board consideration of a way for committees who provide quilts for public outreach, for example the Military and Quilts for COTS Committees, to post their needs on the website to encourage donations from the public. Their guild budgets are inadequate to meet the need. Donors could review requests through the addition of a donation button and contribute using a credit

card. A line would then be added to the guild's budget to monitor contribution income and committee expenses.

Motion/second/call – Shannon/Jayne/All to create a donation button and credit card function.

By-Laws Committee – A committee meeting is needed. Ruth and Garnet were added to the existing committee which also includes Gloria K., Kitty T. and Jean P.

Quilt Show - A chair



person and sub chair persons are needed to organize the 2018 quilt show. Jayne emphasized that space must be booked a year in advance which makes these positions most critical to fill. Block of the Month & Appliqué Blocks for Boutique – There was a brief discussion that members should start early so we will have blocks to sell at the quilt show boutique.

Ribbons for 2018/2019
Fairs – The Board agreed that two years worth of ribbons be purchased at a time. Palmgren's was noted as vendor for these. Ruth was authorized to proceed.

Tables in Back for People Who Want to Sew – Jayne requested this experiment be continued. Sue will handle it.

Block of the Month Members will be notified at the general meeting that participants will need to provide the fabric, if not all the time, at least part of the time.

Other - Jayne reported a request to loan the guild's quilt stands for a special display of quilts at a local funeral memorial service. Board members

suggested she make the arrangements.

Shannon will see that guild policies are posted on the website.

Ruth will prepare a draft 2017/2018 budget for review in August.

Using the Tokyo
International Great Quilt
Festival of 2015 as the
setting for our
observations, Tracey
explored the amazing
handwork of Japanese
quilters depicted in the
show's theme, Little House
on the Prairie. Appliqué,
embroidery and seed

beading are much in favor and are used in borders as well as in centers.

Examples shown included 'brown quilts' designed from the antique fabrics once worn by workers and laborers, 'antique silk kimono quilts' and Japanese specific 'Wa quilts', which means either Japanese in theme or in fabric or both. Quilters use a great variety of very small, intricately sewn pieces of fabric. American words are a favorite just as we might use French worded fabrics. Tracey recommended we visit the Tokyo International some time; it's a direct flight from San Francisco with public transportation to the show and hotel accommodations across the street. What a great idea! Thank you, Tracey.

Block of the Month – The current block is a churn dash pattern. Print fabric and pattern are provided; quilters provide the white background.


Fat Quarter and Strip




