CHALLENGE REMINDER

BLOCKS FOR CAROLE'S QUILT

If you want to help make a quilt for founding member Carole N., please bring in two 9-patch blocks made from batik fabrics.

Using Batik fabrics: Cut three, 3 1/2 inch wide strips, by 11 inches long of one Batik. Cut three, 3 1/2 inch wide strips, by 11 inches long of another Batik of contrasting color. Sew 3 strips together, alternating colors. Press to the dark fabric. Cut the sewn strips across into 3 1/2 inch segments, and then sew then together in alternate settings. There will be extra fabric.
