Presidents' Letter

If you missed Colleen Pelfrey's workshop, "Taking Out the Dye", you missed a good one! The entertaining speaker from our May meeting gave a group of PQG members and friends an opportunity to learn how to create design on fabric using decolorant. Decolorant is a goopy substance applied to fabric in a variety of ways, allowed to dry and then heated with an iron to bring out the design. Colleen brought her quilts to show and told what techniques she used to make her designs. She demonstrated the use of the many supplies and materials she brought, and then turned us loose to play with all of them. And she had quite a few! There were dozens of stencils, stamps, brushes, brayers, gelli pads, freezer paper sheets, sponges and more! She even had a light box, stencil burner and plastic sheets to design and cut your own stencils.

The very first thing Colleen had us do was test our fabric by putting a small dab of decolorant on the corner of each piece of fabric we brought. Decolorant does not always work on every fabric and when it does, the results are sometimes surprising! You might think that applying the substance would simply make the fabric lighter in color, and sometimes it does, but other times you end up with something entirely different. A luscious green fabric might turn a bright yellow-orange, a royal blue might yield a rusty brown! By testing our fabrics, we knew what to expect!

The process was not as messy as you might think and was somewhat forgiving too. If, after using a stamp to apply the decolorant, you were not happy with how it went on, you could just go rinse out your fabric, dry it with a blow dryer and start all over again with out messing up your fabric.

There were so many different things to try that you couldn't possibly try them all in just one day, and many of us left thinking it would be really fun to have Colleen come again another time.

If fabric design is not your thing, maybe volunteering for Guild activities is! We are looking for a VP of Programs for next year, committee members for TriGuild Luncheon planning, and Opportunity quilt sitters at various functions. We have something for everyone! And don't forget about our upcoming retreat here at the Community Center this fall. We have many opportunities for fun and service!
