Want to give back? We have lots of options for quilting and sewing for those in need in our community and beyond! We will have the opportunity to assist with projects for COTs, Days for Girls, Military Quilts, and Project Sleep Warm.

Quilts for COTs - Quilts and pillowcases for homeless and transitioning families in Petaluma. Coordinated by Ellie O.

Military Quilts - Quilts for veterans in Petaluma. Coordinated by Jayne M.

Days for Girls - Around the world, girls and women resort to using rags, mattress stuffing, banana leaves, feathers, and even cow dung to manage their menstruation. Days for Girls provides a safe, beautiful, washable, and long-lasting alternatives she can count on month after month, along with vital health education. Amanda C. runs the Petaluma Chapter of Days For Girls.

Project Sleep Warm is an organization based in Santa Rosa, they make comforters for homeless women and children that get distributed through The Living Room, items for The Baby Closet, who supplies local low-income new moms with things they need for their new babies. They currently make receiving blankets, bibs, and nursing cover-ups.

On our sewing night we will have lots of options for our members learn more about these organizations, as well as helping out with projects. We encourage you to bring your sewing machine, but because this is not possible for everyone to do, we will have stations set up for our members to help out with some of these charities in other ways; cutting, pinning, and pressing. You can even design a quilt for COTs using pre-cut fabric packs and roll up your design to take home and sew!

Monthly Mini: Made and donated by Tanya Carter. The next 3 months need a small quilt or craft item donated to raffle off.


Quilts for COTS: Ellie has 3 more quilts to deliver on Friday.

PQG Awards at the Summer Fairs

Each year, PQG sponsors two awards for quilts entered in the local fairs. The Dorrie Whipple Award is given for Excellence in Machine Quilting at the Sonoma County Fair. Dorrie Whipple was a member of PQG in the latter half of the nineties. Although she was only a member of the guild for a few years, she made a big impact. She served on the board as secretary and also spearheaded several opportunity quilts. She was a talented machine quilter who used a fabulous machine stitch known in the guild as the Whipple Stipple! Her warm and funny personality made her a popular teacher at many Bay Area quilt shops, including the Cotton Patch, Thimblecreek, and the Quilted Angel. She was particularly fond of scrap quilts and had several patterns professionally published. Photos of her quilts were featured in the second edition of Diana McClun and Laura Nownes' book *Quilts, Quilts, Quilts*! Tragically, Dorrie lost her life to cancer in 1997 at the age of 43. PQG then decided to honor her memory by sponsoring this award in her name.

The other award is the Joyce Gross Award of Excellence given at the Sonoma-Marin Fair. Joyce was regarded as one of the nation's most important historians of 20th century quilts and quilt makers. She was a quilter, teacher, lecturer, editor of a quilt newsletter, and collector of all things concerning quilts. Joyce was an honorary Lifetime member of the Petaluma Quilt Guild that sponsors this award. Her quilt collection resides at the Briscoe Center for American History at the University of Texas in Austin. Joyce was named a "National Treasure" by the Alliance for American Quilts, and was inducted into the Quilters Hall of Fame in 1996.


