# Committee Chairpersons Reports:

**Military:** Jayne showed the last 5 quilts that have been finished. She has fabric that needs to be cut out tonight.

**Monthly Mini:** Made and donated by Debby L.

**Quilts for COTS:** Ellie has 4 more quilts to deliver.

Program: Jayne, Ellie, and Amanda explained the work being done for charity guilting. Jayne told about the many pet beds that are stuffed with fabric clippings and donated to the animal shelter. She also reported that the military quilts made by PQG members are given to local homeless veterans through the COTS program. Ellie explained that the group of COTS Quilters make quilts and pillowcases for men. women, and children in the COTS Program (the local homeless shelter). The group meets on the fourth Thursday of the month at Valley Orchards Retirement Community, 10:00-4:00. They sandwich, quilt and bind tops that are made at home by others. We are also

committed to donating 10 quilts this winter to go on top of baskets of necessities which the Voices Project puts together for children aging out of foster care. Our guild has also helped with community emergencies such as donating quilts for fire victims. Amanda is a team leader for the World Wide Organization "Days for Girls". Her Petaluma group meets almost every month at the library, 11:00-2:00. There are kits to make a draw string bag containing a washcloth, soap, underwear, and liners which go to Third World Countries. These charities had tables around the room for members to get more information and help make kits.

**Show & Tell:** Members showed some of their recently completed quilts.

Prizes: Numbers were called at the end of the evening to win door prizes. There will be a special drawing in October for an adorable tote bag made from leftover blocks from the Chicken Opportunity Quilt. You may enter your name to win if you have sold at least \$20 worth of Opportunity Quilt tickets.
