

I can't believe that the holidays have come and gone! And, with winter in full swing, isn't now the perfect time to request some blocks be made for you? The Friendship Block Department is looking forward to more requests from members. Come up with some ideas, and let's put one into motion, and request beautiful blocks be made just for you or your project (see note below).

The Tri-Guild Luncheon is upcoming, and Metha has requested 40 sets of "Fan" blocks made. These are to be fashioned into a lovely centerpiece for each table. Fifteen of you volunteered at the December meeting, but we still need 25 more of you to take the plunge and step up to help. Come see me at the January meeting to turn in your finished blocks, or to sign up to make a set.

NOTE: Each time you make a block for another member, you receive 1 credit. You must have earned some credits, before you can spend them by requesting blocks for yourself.

### TRI-GUILD LUNCHEON - ALL GUILD BLOCK - examples shown at Jan Mtg

### All Guild Block Directions -"Moondance"

### FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The All-Guild Block is a half log cabin block. If you win the blocks, you can turn them "on-point" to make the suggested quilt, or make whatever inspires you!
- 2. Our colors are red, gold and black.
- 3. The strips may be a print (with **one exception**) but they must be predominantly red, gold or black. There are many prints available with these 3 colors.
- The center square will measure 2 1/2" square and MUST be red. It can be solid red or a predominantly red print. It can be a medium or darker red.
- The strips around the center square will measure 2" x various lengths (see Cutting Instructions, below) and can be any combination of solid or print; again, predominantly red, gold or black. Place in a lighter to darker sequence
- 6. The last strips (Color E) MUST be SOLID black.

### SPECIFIC COLOR REQUIREMENTS

Fabric A = **Red** solid or print (dark or medium) Fabric B(1 & 2) = Lighter gold print or solid Fabric C(1 & 2) = Medium gold, red, or combo print Fabric D(1 & 2) = Darker gold, red, black or combo print Fabric E(1 & 2) = **Solid black** (shows as cross-hatching borders when rows of blocks are sewn together).

### CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

You can sew a long strip onto the square and cut it after sewing or you can precut your 2" strips as follows:

Fabric A square	2 1/2"
Fabric B(1)	2" x 2 1/2"
Fabric B(2)	2" x 4"
Fabric C(1)	2" x 4"
Fabric C(2)	2"x 5 1/2"
Fabric D(1)	2" x 5 1/2"
Fabric D(2)	2" x 7"
Fabric E(1)	2" x 7"
Fabric E(2)	2" x 8 1/2"




#### SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Place the center square (Color A) in front of you (on a table).
- Now place the first, shorter strip Color B(1) - on the left of the center square and sew. \*\*\*It is important that the first strip is sewn on the left so all blocks have the same orientation.
- 3. Press **all** seams out from the center square, towards the strip you have just added.
- Place the longer strip of Color B(2) on the top side of the center square, sew and press. Again, for correct block orientation.
- 5. You will continue to follow this sequence for the remaining strips of Colors C, D and E, making sure to have the solid black strips as the last ones added.

### IF YOU WIN THE BLOCKS, OUR SUGGESTED QUILT IS BELOW.

Lay blocks w/ red square on bottom left. Add triangles to both ends to make a row (Row 1 has 1 block; Row 2 has 3 blocks; Row 3 has 5 blocks, etc. Repeat the center row, then reverse order back to 1st row with one block). Sew the rows together. Turn on-point. Add borders, if you like.



## **TRI-GUILD LUNCHEON TABLE FAVORS**

#### The Roaring 20's!!!

Get ready to rouge you knees and roll your stockings down!!! We're headed to the best kept secret in Petaluma, the Tri-Guild Speakeasy. Be on the lookout for feather headbands, boas, and fringe to complete your costume for our Roaring '20's luncheon.

Various members of the committee will teach us how to sew together the table centerpieces, table favors, and blocks to win. Below are directions for the table favors, in case you want to get started on these. We need to make four for each attendee. A demonstration will take place at the December meeting.



**Christmas Folded Fabric Coasters** 

Materials::

1 Charm pack or 40 assorted 5" squares

1/4 yard Fusible fleece cut into 8 5" squares (You can use batting instead of the fusible fleece.)

Directions:

1. From the Charm Pack choose 8 Focus 5" Squares for the back. Press the Fusible Fleece to the wrong side of the squares.

2. Press the remaining 5" Squares in half for the front.

3. Fleece place the 5" focus square right side up.

4. Weave 4 of the folded 5" Squares on right side of the 5" focus back with the raw edges on the outside of the square and the fold toward the center, per the pictures below. Pin. 5. Stitch with a ¼" seam around the outside edge.

6. Trim the corners

7. Flip and Press.



3 half folds



This is what the top looks before vou sew on all 4 raw edges



4<sup>th</sup> half fold

pull the 3rd fold over the 4th half fold
