The Petaluma Masketeers

When the coronavirus pandemic first began ramping up in the United States, the shortage of and need for personal protective equipment rapidly became apparent. Quilters and seamstresses nationwide stepped up to the task of sewing masks at home for use by essential workers. Inquiries and requests began rolling in to the guild's email account, some from as far away as Oregon, Texas and Cameroon!

So when KC Greaney, a Petaluma resident, started a local group providing for local needs and reached out to the guild seeking sewists, this seemed like a request worthy of forwarding on to our membership. A number of PQG members donated supplies or joined the sewing task force, that eventually decided to call themselves the Petaluma Masketeers. This small group of just over 20 members has provided over 2000 masks to local organizations, including COTS, Petaluma People Services Center, Petaluma Health Center, PEP Housing, Heartline Hospice, Petaluma Health Care District, Creekside Memory Board and Care, Sonoma Family Meal and Sebastopol Meals on Wheels.

The group expects to have ongoing requests from COTS, Food for All and Petaluma Health Care, totaling over 225 adult and 70 kid masks per week. If you would like to join in the efforts, contact KC for further info:

Quilting Resources at Sonoma County Library

Are you stuck at home and bored with nothing to do? Or perhaps you would like a distraction from all the chores you would really rather NOT do? Then check out the online resources at the Sonoma County Library. I was pleased to find quite a number of quilting magazines available to check out with a library card, for downloading to your computer, tablet or phone. Then you can read the issue right on your device. Quilting titles available include Love Patchwork and Quilting, Quilting Arts, American Patchwork and Quilting, Modern Patchwork and Love of Quilting. Many other periodicals on a vast variety of subjects are available as well!

Don't have a library card or your current one has expired? No problem! The library can issue you a temporary eCard online, which allows you to borrow and use electronic resources. The eCard will automatically expire after 120 days, and once the library is open again you can visit any branch and convert your eCard to a permanent library card. How wonderful to have this resource available while sheltering in place!
