Sew Many Quilts

The Corona 1 is a Corona challenge with my Ronald McDonald mini group (bottom left). Eva's quilt (right of rooster) is also called the Happy Quilt. It is cheerful and easy. I am on my fifth one and I still have more fabric left over. The Savanna quilt (bottom right) was the Broadway BOM which I worked on at the PQG retreat. The Dragon Quilt (right) is for my daughter's best friend who has her second baby a week ago. She was worried that Big Brother would be left out so we gave him this guilt. (I am making a Happy Quilt for his new baby sister.) The Rooster Quilt (below) is a Laura Heine pattern. I took the Henrietta class at Broadway and had so much fun and leftovers, that I was able to make the Rooster.











Sewing and Sheltering in Place

Well I've kept busy. I made some military quilt kits and Susan H is working on 2 for me, I've cut 105 pet beds and Lillian sewed 15, any volunteers? I've quilted 10 military quilts, bound 4, quilted 8 COTS quilts, bound one so far. I started on the 40 plus of tops Lillian and I made during the fall and have quilted 11 of them so far.

I had to stay off my feet for a week because plantar fasciitis flared up. I worked on my Quilt-at-home, shelter at home little house quilt, almost done and then today started a 3/4 inch hand stitched paper pieced Hexagon quilt.

Now if I could only find some bread flour and toilet paper is be set for another month. Wash your hands and keep on stitching.
