Approval of Minutes: The Minutes of the last Board Meeting were unanimously approved as printed in the latest newsletter.

Treasurer's Report:

Elisabeth reported there has been no activity. She is asking for members to turn in any unreimbursed expenses by August 15 to close out the fiscal year. The Guild has its own Zoom account now.

Newsletter Report: There is a committee of past newsletter people taking over the job plus one additional member. Marilyn is still hoping to find someone to take the job on outright. **Program's Report:** Shannon has spoken to all the scheduled speakers and rescheduled them for 2021. Using Zoom for Meetings

Anyone remember the children's programming out of Boston on public television back in the 70's? It was called Zoom and it's theme song went something like this: Zoom, Zoom, Zoom, Zoom-A-Zoom! Come on and Zoom-A-Zoom-A-Zoom-A-Zoom! Come on give it a

A-Zoom! Come on give it a try! We're gonna show you just why! We're gonna teach you to fly! High! Come on and Zoom! Come on and Zoom-Zoom! Come on and Zoom! Come on and Zoom-Zoom!

Well, with no end to the pandemic in sight and the date of returning to regular in-person meetings a big question mark, this could be PQG's theme song too! The Zoom platform offers us a way to meet, conduct business and enjoy each other's company and quilts, all while social distancing. Each of our two previous meetings via Zoom have had about 25 participants, and we would love to have more members join us! If you

haven't joined us, why not? The paragraphs below attempt to address some concerns that some of us may have.

I don't know anything

about it. First off you need to download the Zoom application to your desktop computer or mobile device. Choose the "free" option. We will send you an email the day prior to the meeting, which will include a link to our meeting. Join the meeting on the day and time specified. Activate your video and audio. If you choose the "active speaker" option, whoever is speaking will automatically show up on the main screen, while participants will appear in smaller screens. You can participate by raising your hand to speak or using the chat function. Otherwise. just sit back and enjoy!

How do I join a meeting?

The easiest way is to click on the link provided in the email we send and you will automatically be sent to our meeting. If you open the Zoom application first and chose "join a meeting," you will be asked for a Zoom ID number and a password. These are also provided in our emails, but the simplest way to join is to open our email and click on the link provided.

I haven't had a hair cut in 5 months and I don't want anyone to see me

like this! No problem! You can leave your video turned off and we will see an outline of a person and your name. You will still be able to see and hear everyone else. But seriously, we are all in the same boat and we are all friends here! If you are concerned about how you look on camera. Zoom does offer a hack for that. Under Settings > Video, click on "Touch up my appearance" and Zoom will soften the focus on your camera, giving a more flattering image. Also try to position yourself directly opposite the

camera by adjusting the height of your seat or propping up your device. This helps prevent the upthe-nostrils view. Good lighting helps too. Try to have an overhead light source from in front of you, not behind, and pros often use a second light source from the side as well.

I'm afraid my husband will walk by in his underwear and besides that, my house is a

mess! Zoom can help you! Well, they won't clean up your house, and your husband is your problem, but they offer a virtual background option where your image will appear in front of a stock photo that you chose, or you can even upload one of your own photos! However, this is not a good option if you plan to hold up a show and tell piece. It will tend to disappear in interference with the image. In that case it would be better to photograph your quilt ahead of time, and then share the photo at the meeting. If you are going to hold up a show and tell item in front of your camera, remember to

keep talking so your image will remain in the active speaker position. Tell us why you made it, what pattern you used or if you designed it yourself, what fabrics or techniques you used, etc., etc. We ask participants to keep quiet at this time, so as not to commandeer the screen.

I planned to attend, but I forgot the day in this %! @#\$& pandemic! Yeah.

we get it! Set a reminder on your smart phone or make plans to watch and attend with a friend and hopefully one of the two of you will remember! Zoom itself will send you a reminder if you set it up ahead of time.

I just don't think I will like it. It won't be the

same! Well, you are right, it is not the same, but it is the best option we have right now to maintain some sort of auild community and I'd like share my experience with SSU with you. In the past, I have taken classes at Sonoma State University's OLLI program (Osher Life Long Learning Institute.) After cancelling classes this spring due to the pandemic, they sent out a survey to see if folks would participate in Zoom classes. I actually replied

that I would NOT participate! I just didn't think it would be the same! But then they offered the first month's classes for free and I decided to try it, and to my surprise, it was great! I didn't have to drive there and search for parking, I could hear and see the presentation better, all while working on my quilt project, with cup of coffee at hand, and from the comfort of my recliner! I was sold! So I hope you will give our meetings a try and you may be pleasantly surprised too!


BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Use Autumn Color Batiks Contrast Colors This makes a 12" block!


* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



First cut the Color 2 4-1/2" x 9" strip into two 4-1/2" squares ...




Then cut the Color 1 4-1/2" x 13-1/2" strip into three 4-1/2" squares...



Next, to speed piece the half squares...stack the Color 1 and Color 2 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strips, right sides together and all edges aligned. Mark the 4-7/8" square line and mark the diagonals in the direction shown. Sew 1/4" above and below the marked diagonals, pivoting at the square lines. Then cut apart ON the marked diagonal, and at the 4-7/8" square line. This will give you four half squares. Press seams towards darker fabrics...

August **BOM**




Now, to make the stem, cut one Color 2 4-1/2" square in half diagonally. Crease lightly to find the half way point of the diagonal edge. Crease the Color 1 1-3/4" x 7" stem strip to find its half way point also...

Matching the mid points, sew the stem strip to one half square triangle. Press seam towards stem strip. Sew the other half square triangle to the stem, again matching mid points. Press seam towards stem. Using a ruler or square-up acrylic square, cut this unit back to measure 4-1/2"...on to Page 2!







1/2 page: 6 mo.-\$75, 1 yr.-\$125 Full page: \$50 each time
