QUILTS FOR COTS

We have continued to sew and quilt at home, and this is a recap of our efforts for the past months. We delivered 40 quilts and 60 pillowcases to fire evacuees, and an additional 10 quilts and pillowcases to the Family Emergency Center. The Mary Isaak Homeless Center received 16 quilts and pillowcases during Oct. and Nov. Thanks to everyone, especially Jayne and Liane who help refill the inventory. Thanks also to the members who have picked up pillowcase kits and fabric packets and returned oh so creative works of art!! I love our porch visits.

We NEED pillowcases for adults. Quilt tops should measure approx.--Adult (48 x 78) and Children (any size up to 42 x 54). I have NEW fabric packets ready and waiting! The total number of quilts that have been delivered since the original group formed in 1993 is **3766.** As always, thank you for supporting this project and the homeless in our community. Ellie

Using Zoom for Meetings

Anyone remember the children's programming out of Boston on public television back in the 70's? It was called Zoom and it's theme song went something like this: Zoom, Zoom, Zoom-A-Zoom! Come on and Zoom-A-Zoom-A-Zoom-A-Zoom! Come on give it a try! We're gonna show you just why! We're gonna teach you to fly! High! Come on and Zoom! Come on and Zoom-Zoom! Come on and Zoom! Come on and Zoom-Zoom!

Well, with no end to the pandemic in sight and the date of returning to regular in-person meetings a big question mark, this could be PQG's theme song too! The Zoom platform offers us a way to meet, conduct business and enjoy each other's company and quilts, all while social distancing. Each of our two previous meetings via Zoom have had about 25 participants, and we would love to have more members join us! If you

haven't joined us, why not? The paragraphs below attempt to address some concerns that some of us may have.

I don't know anything about it. First off you need to download the Zoom application to your desktop computer or mobile device. Choose the "free" option. We will send you an email the day prior to the meeting, which will include a link to our meeting. Join the meeting on the day and time specified. Activate your video and audio. If you choose the "active speaker" option, whoever is speaking will automatically show up on the main screen, while participants will appear in smaller screens. You can participate by raising your hand to speak or using the chat function. Otherwise, just sit back and enjoy!

How do I join a meeting?

The easiest way is to click on the link provided in the email we send and you will automatically be sent to our meeting. If you open the Zoom application first and chose "join a meeting," you will be asked for a Zoom ID number and a password. These are also provided in our emails, but the simplest way to join is to open our email and click on the link provided.

I haven't had a hair cut in 5 months and I don't want anyone to see me like this! No problem! You can leave your video turned off and we will see an outline of a person and your name. You will still be able to see and hear everyone else. But seriously, we are all in the same boat and we are all friends here! If you are concerned about how you look on camera, Zoom does offer a hack for that. Under Settings > Video, click on "Touch up my appearance" and Zoom will soften the focus on your camera, giving a more flattering image. Also try to position yourself directly opposite the camera by adjusting the height of your seat or propping up your device. This helps prevent the up-the-nostrils view. Good lighting helps too. Try to have an overhead light source from in front of you, not behind, and pros often

use a second light source from the side as well.

I'm afraid my husband will walk by in his underwear and besides that, my house is a mess! Zoom can help you! Well, they won't clean up your house, and your husband is *your* problem, but they offer a virtual background option where your image will appear in front of a stock photo that you chose, or you can even upload one of your own photos! However, this is not a good option if you plan to hold up a show and tell piece. It will tend to disappear in interference with the image. In that case it would be better to photograph your quilt ahead of time, and then share the photo at the meeting. If you are going to hold up a show and tell item in front of your camera, remember to keep talking so your image will remain in the active speaker position. Tell us why you made it, what pattern you used or if you designed it yourself, what fabrics or techniques you used, etc., etc. We ask participants to keep quiet at this time, so as not to commandeer the screen.

I planned to attend, but I forgot the day in this %!@#\$& pandemic! Yeah, we get it! Set a reminder

on your smart phone or make plans to watch and attend with a friend and hopefully one of the two of you will remember! Zoom itself will send you a reminder if you set it up ahead of time.

I just don't think I will like it. It won't be the same!

Well, you are right, it is not the same, but it is the best option we have right now to maintain some sort of guild community and I'd like share my experience with SSU with you. In the past, I have taken classes at Sonoma State University's OLLI program (Osher Life Long Learning Institute.) After cancelling classes this spring due to the pandemic, they sent out a survey to see if folks would participate in Zoom classes. I actually replied that I would NOT participate! I just didn't think it would be the same! But then they offered the first month's classes for free and I decided to try it, and to my surprise, it was great! I didn't have to drive there and search for parking, I could hear and see the presentation better, all while working on my quilt project, with cup of coffee at hand, and from the comfort of my recliner! I was sold! So I hope you will give our meetings a try

and you may be pleasantly surprised too!

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

PQG December 2020 Block of the Month Winter Beanies



Materials and Cutting:

Beanie: Any cotton fabric that looks like a beanie material. I used a Fair Isle fabric.

Cut a rectangle 7 ½" X 8 ½"

Beanie Band: Color coordinate with the beanie. Cut a 2 1/2 " x 8 ½" strip Pom-pom: You may create a pom-pom how you wish. I used a 1 ½" and a 2" circle in the photos below. I put a small, small piece of stuffing under it and blanket stitched it. See templates below.

Background: Out of snowy white fabrics (I used white tone on tone with snowflakes), Cut Two 4" squares, One 2 ½" X 8 ½" strip and one 2 ½" x 11 ½" strip.


Construction:

Mark a diagonal line on your 4" squares. Sew to top corners of the beanie. The vertical sides are the $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " sides. Cut the triangle off with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Attach strips as shown.





It took me 15 minutes to make it from cutting to finish. So I made three!



Make a pom-pom either 11/2 or 2" diameter circle. If making a yoyo use a 3" circle. Pin it so that the quilter can remove it to quilt. I used a blanket stitch with a small piece of poly filling underneath. No real pom-poms please.

MILITARY QUILTS

Military Quilts is continuing with the Shoo Fly pattern (see below). Jayne can provide fabric, if needed. Contact her and she will make sure you get fabric to make the Shoofly block. She can also **deliver** it to you if you are unable to pick it up. Jayne will also answer any questions that you may have re this pattern or military quilts in general:





Color 1 needs: one 4-1/2" x 18" strip AND one


If you need fabric just ask and I'll get you some. strip AND one 4-1/2" square



Color 2 needs: one 4-7/8" x 9-3/4"

Please use RED, WHITE or BLUE fabrics.

This makes a 12 " block!



October 2020 Military Block of the Month

** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **

SHOOFLY




First, stack the two 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strips right sides together, then cut into two 4-7/8" squares of each...

Next, stack and cut the 4-7/8" squares on the diagonal, being careful not to stretch fabric!



Then cut the Color 1 4-1/2" x 18" strip into four 4-1/2 " squares...



Sew four Color 1 triangles to four Color 2 triangles, right sides together along the diagonals using a 1/4" seam, and being careful NOT to stretch fabrics. Press seams towards darker fabric



Lay out your units as shown at left. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing the top and bottom row seams to the outside, and the middle row seam to the center. Join the rows ... and there you have it! a completed SHOOFLY block!




Petaluma Quilt Guild Remembers
Joyce Gross-Collector, Researcher, Quilt Historian

The Guild's library has been gifted a donation of books from the collection of Joyce Gross by her daughter, Vicki Chase, and we will be delighted to make them available to PQG members once we can resume meeting together.

Joyce Gross, a graduate of UC Berkeley, former resident of Petaluma [20 years on D Street] and Mill Valley, and former member of PQG was well-known locally and recognized nationally. Her life's work was sparked by the purchase of an old quilt. Over the years her collection expanded to include more than 170 historically significant quilts by American quilters from the late 1930s to 2002. According to Vicki, our own Ellie O'Conner helped her with her quilt collection. Through Joyce's research, she became a leading historian of twentieth century quilts and quilters. The collection is now housed in the Briscoe Center of

quilts and quilters. The collection is now housed in the Briscoe Center of American History in Austin, Texas. You may recognize Joyce through some of her other activities, namely the establishment of the Point Bonita quilting retreats and publication of the *Quilters' Journal*. She was inducted into the Quilters Hall of Fame in 1996.

We wish to thank Vicki Chase for sharing her mother's legacy with the Petaluma Quilt Guild. Pictures below show book titles received.






