# Using Zoom for Meetings

Anyone remember the children's programming out of Boston on public television back in the 70's? It was called Zoom and it's theme song went something like this: Zoom, Zoom, Zoom-A-Zoom! Come on and Zoom-A-Zoom-A-Zoom-A-Zoom! Come on give it a try! We're gonna show you just why! We're gonna teach you to fly! High! Come on and Zoom! Come on and Zoom-Zoom! Come on and Zoom! Come on and Zoom-Zoom!個

Well, with no end to the pandemic in sight and the date of returning to regular in-person meetings a big question mark, this could be PQG's theme song too! The Zoom platform offers us a way to meet, conduct business and enjoy each other's company and quilts, all while social distancing. Each of our two previous meetings via Zoom have had about 25 participants, and we would love to have more members join us! If you

haven't joined us, why not? The paragraphs below attempt to address some concerns that some of us may have.

I don't know anything about it. First off you need to download the Zoom application to your desktop computer or mobile device. Choose the "free" option. We will send you an email the day prior to the meeting, which will include a link to our meeting. Join the meeting on the day and time specified. Activate your video and audio. If you choose the "active speaker" option, whoever is speaking will automatically show up on the main screen, while participants will appear in smaller screens. You can participate by raising your hand to speak or using the chat function. Otherwise, just sit back and enjoy!

### How do I join a meeting?

The easiest way is to click on the link provided in the email we send and you will automatically be sent to our meeting. If you open the Zoom application first and chose "join a meeting," you will be asked for a Zoom ID number and a password. These are also provided in our emails, but the simplest way to join is to open our email and click on the link provided.

I haven't had a hair cut in 5 months and I don't want anyone to see me like this! No problem! You can leave your video turned off and we will see an outline of a person and your name. You will still be able to see and hear everyone else. But seriously, we are all in the same boat and we are all friends here! If you are concerned about how you look on camera, Zoom does offer a hack for that. Under Settings > Video, click on "Touch up my appearance" and Zoom will soften the focus on your camera, giving a more flattering image. Also try to position yourself directly opposite the camera by adjusting the height of your seat or propping up your device. This helps prevent the up-the-nostrils view. Good lighting helps too. Try to have an overhead light source from in front of you, not behind, and pros often

use a second light source from the side as well.

I'm afraid my husband will walk by in his underwear and besides that, my house is a mess! Zoom can help you! Well, they won't clean up your house, and your husband is *your* problem, but they offer a virtual background option where your image will appear in front of a stock photo that you chose, or you can even upload one of your own photos! However, this is not a good option if you plan to hold up a show and tell piece. It will tend to disappear in interference with the image. In that case it would be better to photograph your quilt ahead of time, and then share the photo at the meeting. If you are going to hold up a show and tell item in front of your camera, remember to keep talking so your image will remain in the active speaker position. Tell us why you made it, what pattern you used or if you designed it yourself, what fabrics or techniques you used, etc., etc. We ask participants to keep quiet at this time, so as not to commandeer the screen.

I planned to attend, but I forgot the day in this %!@#\$& pandemic! Yeah,

we get it! Set a reminder on your smart phone or make plans to watch and attend with a friend and hopefully one of the two of you will remember! Zoom itself will send you a reminder if you set it up ahead of time.

I just don't think I will like it. It won't be the same! Well, you are right, it is not the same, but it is the best option we have right now to maintain some sort of guild community and I'd like share my experience with SSU with you. In the past, I have taken classes at Sonoma State University's OLLI program (Osher Life Long Learning Institute.) After cancelling classes this spring due to the pandemic, they sent out a survey to see if folks would participate in Zoom classes. I actually replied that I would NOT participate! I just didn't think it would be the same! But then they offered the first month's classes for free and I decided to try it, and to my surprise, it was great! I didn't have to drive there and search for parking, I could hear and see the presentation better, all while working on my quilt project, with cup of coffee at hand, and from the comfort of my recliner! I

was sold! So I hope you will give our meetings a try and you may be pleasantly surprised too!

# **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**

PQG January 2021 Block of the Month Hello 2021! (Throw Snowballs at 2020!)



### **Materials and Cutting:**

**Snowballs:** 4 assorted light or medium fabrics 5 ½" x 5 ½" squares


**Background:** Winter Blue; (12) 2" squares and (4) 2 ½" x 5 ½" rectangles

Center Star: Jewel Tone; (4) 2" squares and (1) 2 ½" square

### **Construction:**

Make snowballs with one jewel tone square and 3 background squares. Use the flip and stitch method (https://quiltnotes.com/learning-center/stitch-and-flip/)





Arrange the layout of snowballs and sew on the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.



Sew a partial seam for the center star by placing the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square on the upper left snowball.





Attach the upper right section to the upper left section. Attach the lower right section next. Attach the last section finishing the partial seam.

### **MILITARY QUILTS**

Military Quilts is changing to **Road to Oklahoma**. Contact Jayne and she will make sure you get fabric to make the block. She can also **deliver** it to you if you are unable to pick it up. Jayne will also answer any questions that you may have re this pattern or military quilts in general:

For a Red White & Blue 12 inch finished Road to Oklahoma block you will need:

From your background cut two 3 7/8 inch (or 4") squares and six 3 1/2 inch squares (for this block the background is white)

From your blue cut two 3 7/8 inch (or 4") squares and two 3 1/2 inch squares From your red cut four 3 1/2 inch squares.



You will need four diagonal half squares for this block. First, mark your 3 7/8 (or 4 inch and square it up after) inch background squares diagonally through the center. (This will be a cutting line when you are finished.) Place your blue square, right sides together, with the background. Sew on either side of the drawn line, exactly 1/4 inch from the first line. Cut this square in half on the cutting line. Trim off the corners, or dog ears as some people like to call them. You will now have two diagonal half-squares, which should measure exactly 3 1/2 inches. Repeat with the remaining 3 7/8 inch squares (or 4 inch method and squaring after).


This four patch unit is made from your diagonal half squares and a blue and a background squares.



The next step will be to build two different four patch units. First sew a background and blue 3 1/2 inch squares together, and then another pair. Sew those together into a four patch unit. Make another unit just like that one. The finished units should measure 6 1/2 inches.



Now assemble as shown. Your finished block should measure 12 1/2 inches.



Hello Quilters, Please keep the colors as shown in the directions. I have lots of fabric and can deliver if needed. This block will makes up into a great quilt that a veteran would be proud to use. 


### Quilt Tip:
