


Thank you secret Pal for the cute ornament. I hung it on my hutch after to admire it all year. you have great taste. Debby L

Be Aware: Email Phishing Scams

Recently some of our guild members received an email that looked like it was from Denise Ragozzoni and the subject line was "Petaluma Quilt Guild". The email asked users to send money and click on a link. This was a "phishing email" also known as scam email.

How to Recognize Phishing

Scammers use email or text messages to trick you into giving them your personal information. They may try to steal your passwords, account numbers, or Social Security numbers.

If they get that information, they could gain access to your email, bank, or other accounts. Scammers launch thousands of phishing attacks like these every day – and they're often successful.

The FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center reported that people lost \$57 million to phishing schemes in one year.

Scammers often update their tactics, but there are some signs that will help you recognize a phishing email or text message.

Phishing emails and text messages may look like they're from a company you know or trust. They may look like they're from a bank, a credit card company, a social networking site, an online payment website or app, or an online store.

Phishing emails and text messages often tell a story to trick you into clicking on a link or opening an attachment. They may

- say they've noticed some suspicious activity or log-in attempts
- claim there's a problem with your account or your payment information
- say you must confirm some personal information
- include a fake invoice want you to click on a link to make a payment say you're eligible to register for a government refund
- offer a coupon for free stuff

Continued: Email Phishing Scams

What to Do If You Suspect a Phishing Attack

Scams

If you get an email or a text message that asks you to click on a link or open an attachment, answer this question:

Do I have an account with the company or know the person that contacted me? If the answer is "No," it could be a phishing scam. Do not click the link.

Delete the message.

If the answer is "Yes," contact the company using a phone number or website you know is real. Not the information in the email. Attachments and links can install harmful malware.

What to Do If You Responded to a Phishing Email

If you think a scammer has your information, like your Social Security, credit card, or bank account number, go to <u>IdentityTheft.gov</u>.

There you'll see the specific steps to take based on the information that you lost.

If you think you clicked on a link or opened an attachment that downloaded harmful software, update your computer's security software. Then run a scan.

In the case of the Petaluma Quilt Guild, there were a few clues that made members stop and act before clicking on any links.

The "from" email address was "Denis Ragozzoni", Denis and not Denise. Also, the email address in the "from" was not Denise's email address.

Bottom line is, if it seems strange, it probably is. Always check if you suspect something "phishy".

One member reported that this happened in another guild she was in as well, and there is some thought that these hackers are attacking church groups, quilt guilds and other small vulnerable groups.

February Block of the Month - Shoo Fly with a Twist

Bring to February 2nd meeting

Fabric:

Bright White on White A Medium and a Dark Tonal Red

Cut: Light bright White: Cut 2 - 4" squares and 4 - 3 ½" squares Medium Red: 2 - 4" squares Dark Red : 1 3 ½" square




Directions:

Make 4 Half Square Triangles using the two light white 4" squares and the two Medium Red squares. (Place right sides together, draw a diagonal line, sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the line. Cut on drawn line, press to medium red and square up to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square)

Assemble Shoo Fly block, press and square up to 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Measure in 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ " (center) and cut through the block in both directions. Now assemble the block as shown. The unfinished size should be 9"X9" For questions contact

MILITARY QUILTS

Military Quilts is currently making to Road to Oklahoma blocks. Contact Jayne and she will make sure you get fabric to make the block. She can also deliver it to you if you are unable to pick it up. Jayne will also answer any questions that you may have re this pattern or military quilts in general:

For a Red White & Blue 12 inch finished Road to Oklahoma block you will need:

From your background cut two 3 7/8 inch (or 4") squares and six 3 1/2 inch squares (for this block the background is white)

From your blue cut two 3 7/8 inch (or 4") squares and two 3 1/2 inch squares From your red cut four 3 1/2 inch squares.




You will need four diagonal half squares for this block. First, mark your 3 7/8 (or 4 inch and square it up after) inch background squares diagonally through the center. (This will be a cutting line when you are finished.) Place your blue square, right sides together, with the background. Sew on either side of the drawn line, exactly 1/4 inch from the first line. Cut this square in half on the cutting line. Trim off the corners, or dog ears as some people like to call them. You will now have two diagonal half-squares, which should measure exactly 3 1/2 inches. Repeat with the remaining 3 7/8 inch squares (or 4 inch method and squaring after).


This four patch unit is made from your diagonal half squares and a blue and a background squares.



The next step will be to build two different four patch units. First sew a background and blue 3 1/2 inch squares together, and then another pair. Sew those together into a four patch unit. Make another unit just like that one. The finished units should measure 6 1/2 inches.



Now assemble as shown. Your finished block should measure 12 1/2 inches.



Hello Quilters, Please keep the colors as shown in the directions. I have lots of fabric and can deliver if needed. This block will makes up into a great quilt that a veteran would be proud to use. 
