Snowflake 12" finished block

Fabric #1 White tonal Cut:

(A) 4 2 1/2" squares

(B) 8 1 1/2" X 2 1/2" rectangles

(C) 4 3" square

(D) N/A

(E) 4 2 1/2" X 5 1/2"

(F) 4 3 1/2" squares

For blue, green or red snow flakes Cut:

(C) 4 3" squares

(D) 8 2 1/2" squares

For middle star cut:


(A) 1 2 1/2" square

(G) 8 1 1/2" squares


1. Make 1/2 square triangles with pieces C with your chosen method





Sew a 1 1/2 " square to each side of the bottom of the 2 %" X 5 %" rectangle using the flip and stitch (https://www.nationalquilterscircle.com/video/stitch-and-flip-tutorial-003596/#)

Military Block of the Month



Antique Tiles

Fall 2021 Military block. This_block will finish to 12 ½

Supply list: Color 1 Red Color 2 Blue one 2-½ x 10" strip and one 2 ½ x 18" strip one 2 ½ x 18" strip and one 4 ½" square

Color 3 White one 2 1/2 x 18" strip

CUTTING::





Start by marking and cutting the Color 1 and Color 2 2-1/2" x 10" strips into four 2-1/2" squares of each...

Next mark and cut the 2 1/2 x 18 " strips of Colors 1, 2 and 3 into four 2 ½ x 4 ½ rectangles of each...

Sew the Color 1 RED and Color 2 BLUE right sides toget Pairs. Press seam to darker side. You will make four sets.







Sew the Color 2 BLUE

s to the side of the square pairs... two on the left and then two on the right with Color 1 RED square on the bottom in each pair. These will be the block's four corner units. You will be making 2 sets that are opposite.

Sew the Color 1 and Color 3 rectangles right sides together in pairs along one long edge, again using a scant 1/4" seam. Press seam to darker side. Make four units like this for the block's sides...



Now piece the block! Lay out all your units as shown at left, then sew three horizontal rows. Press top and bottom row seams towards the outsides, and center row seam towards the middle. ...and then join the rows!

This is shown in blue and white, but I want it to be red, white and blue for a military block.
