
Discussion of how to document fees from Square platform. Agreement to keep a minimum amount of cash in the checking account, moving income more frequently to the savings account.

IMPORTANT CHANGES RE RETREAT

Walker Creek - Feb 24, 25, 26, 2023

So I got all the information from Walker Creek, and there are big changes to what was told to me previously.

They have a food company who will be taking care of the meals, and we are **NOT** to bring our own meals in. Our snack table is still okay. We must have 10 full time people going, and I don't see a problem with that.

I totally understand this is not what I presented to you. We don't have any control of what they do. If you signed up and are rethinking it, or if you want to join us, PLEASE EMAIL ME ASAP!

So it will be run like it use to be.

Full time Feb. 24 at 2 PM till Feb. 26 3:30 PM

Cost food \$178.50 Lodging \$189.00

Total Cost \$367.50

So here is the breakdown of the prices

Lodging is \$189.00 for the two nights

Breakfast \$25.00

Lunch \$28.25

Dinner \$36.00

Day Trippers are \$26.00 Plus the meal cost

Walker Creek is really sticking to the rules.

I have to have the numbers who are coming by January 21, and all money is to be paid by January 24. !!!!!

If you cancel 30 - 59 days out, you will be responsible for 50% of the cost.

If you cancel 11 - 29 days out, you will be responsible for 75% of the cost.

If you cancel 1 - 10 days out, you will be responsible for 100% of the cost.

Winter 2022 - 2023 Military Block

- 1 Blue or Red 10" Square
- 1 White, white on white or cream 10" Square

Block Assembly

- Step 1: Take one white/cream 10" square and one blue/red 10" square (Graphic 1)
- Step 2: Place them right sides together. (Graphic 2)
- Step 3: Stitch around the perimeter of the block, 1/4" from the outside edge. (Graphic 3)
- Step 4: Using a rotary cutter and ruler, slice on each diagonal. (Graphic 4)
- Step 5: You will now have four half square triangles. Press open. (Graphic 5)
- Step 6: Place half square triangles in an arrow shape. (Graphic 6)
- Step 7: Place two top blocks right sides together, and sew with a 1/4" seam. Do the same to the bottom two blocks (Graphic 7)
- Step 8: Place the top and bottom piece right sides together as shown in Graphic 8 and sew a 1/4" seam.

Press.

Finish block should now measure 12.5 x 12.5
