Call Meeting to Order -The meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM by Debby L.

Minutes of the February 7, 2023 General Meeting- a motion was made to approve the minutes as circulated in the February Newsletter. The members voted to approve the minutes by a show of hands.

President's News- President Debby welcomed everyone. Debby was contacted by a family that wants someone to make lap quilts for family members to remember a loved one who died and encouraged anyone who might be willing to make the quilts to contact Debby.

Monthly Mini- The monthly mini is a shamrock themed mini quilt. Tickets are \$1.00 or 6 for \$5.00. Everyone was encouraged to buy tickets for the Monthly Mini at the break.

**Fat Quarters** – Be sure to turn in your blue fat quarters for the Fat Quarters raffle.

Janet won the blue fat quarters and chose Batik quarters for the April meeting.

Treasurer's report Marilyn-Marilyn will send the treasurer's report to members via e-mail.

**COTS Military Quilts** - Military blocks and quilts are available for assembly.

Castoff -There is also a cast-off table where members can donate or take items. Items that have not been taken will be donated to Legacy, a thrift store for quilters and crafters in Sebastopol.

We have participated in two successful craft fairs; we raffled off a featherweight sewing machine, an opportunity quilt and numerous Tri-guild baskets; we have received donations, both big and small, of money, equipment and supplies; we have monthly mini donations that have brought in more money now than we did back when we had more members; we have groups of people currently working on two future opportunity quilts! All this has shown that our members love this guild and want it to continue, and we can raise the money to do it.

It won't be long before we will call for volunteers to serve on the board for the next fiscal year. Check out the position descriptions in our by-laws and talk to current board members. Maybe this is your year to step up? We know we can count on members to raise funds. We will soon need members to raise their hands and volunteer for positions. How about you?


