We all love quilting, most of the time, and we are many different quilting "personalities". Quilters often exhibit various traits and preferences that can shape their quilting style. What is your quilting personality?

- 1. Traditionalist:
 - Enjoys classic quilt patterns and techniques.
 - Values the history and heritage of quilting.
 - Likely to use traditional fabrics and color schemes.

1. Innovator:

- Enjoys experimenting with new techniques and materials.
- Willing to push the boundaries of traditional quilting.
- Often incorporates modern design elements.
- 2. Precision Quilter:
 - Values accuracy and attention to detail.
 - Enjoys intricate piecing and complex quilt blocks.
 - Takes time to measure and cut fabric precisely.
- 3. Improvisational Quilter:
 - Prefers a more free-form and spontaneous approach.
 - Enjoys creating unique designs without strict patterns.
 - May use unconventional fabrics and colors.
- 4. Art Quilter:
 - Views quilting as a form of artistic expression.
 - Focuses on creating visually stunning and unique pieces.
 - May incorporate various mixed-media elements into quilts.
- 5. Community Quilter:
 - Enjoys quilting as a social activity.
 - Participates in quilting groups, clubs, or classes.
 - Values sharing ideas and collaborating with other quilters.
- 6. Historical Quilter:
 - Fascinated by the historical aspects of quilting.
 - Enjoys reproducing vintage quilt patterns.
 - May research and replicate quilting styles from specific time periods.
- 7. Practical Quilter:
 - Quilts primarily for functional purposes.
 - Creates quilts for everyday use, such as bed quilts or blankets.
 - Prioritizes comfort and durability.

January 2, 2024

Treasurer's Report – Rebecca Hawk Lynch (aka Becky Lynch) has stepped down as treasurer of the PQG and Victoria P appointed Marilyn Ferrick to be treasurer. A motion was made and seconded to approve Marilyn as treasurer, a key executive position. Marilyn was approved by acclamation with no dissent. There was no treasurer's report. Opportunity Quilt - The Opportunity Quilt 24-25 needs a new chairperson as Marilyn F has stepped down to be treasurer.

Membership – Sue D reported that 27 members were present at the meeting.

Ways and Means – Debby L reported that Marilyn F and Amanda C went to the Windsor Craft Fair with some success. A report from that event will be made later.

Block of the Month – There were two Block of the Month drawings. Nancy L won the folded pinwheel blocks and Sally A won the Christmas blocks. Congratulations to Nancy and Sally! Thanks to Brenda D for her hard work on the Block of the Month. She asked to take a break from BOM and Melissa H volunteered to do it.

COTS– Ellie O reported that 13 quilts for children were donated to Kids First Family shelter and 4 quilts and pillowcases were donated to the homeless shelter in December. Please volunteer to take a kit to make a quilt for those in need.

Military Quilts – Jayne M has worked tirelessly making kits for military quilts. Members can help her by taking a kit and making a quilt. Thank you, Jayne. **Program** –Julie announced that there are still 2–3 slots left for the workshop on March 2. There are still some sacks with orphan blocks waiting to be made into a 36 inch quilt. If you were not inspired by the sack you took last month, try taking another!

The program was a presentation by Anele Belden on Dresden Blade quilt making. She showed some historical quilts and modern quilts from her book, *Thoroughly Modern Dresden*.

By the end of the meeting, the Borders workshop was filled to capacity and all the orphan block bags were taken!
