Petaluma Quilt Guild Board Meeting Minutes

July 11, 2024 Meeting called to order at: 4:30 PM

Board Members present: Victoria P, President; Julie S, Vice President Program; Sue D, Vice President Membership; Marilyn F, Treasurer and Shari K, Secretary. Approval of the minutes from past meeting – Minutes of the March meeting were approved previously by e-mail.

President: Victoria P requested more information about a budget committee to develop the 2024–25 budget and a date for a budget meeting. Debby L has volunteered to serve. Marilyn F will prepare the financial information needed for the budget meeting and will contact additional members to serve on the budget committee. The meeting will tentatively be scheduled some time in August after the August General meeting.

Victoria stated that she will not be able to continue as President for the 2024–25 year as she has other commitments. We will need to recruit someone for the office of President as well as Vice President for Programs. Victoria will contact members that the board recommended to fill these positions. The board also discussed the future of the Petaluma Quilt Guild if we are unable to find members willing to serve in leadership positions. Victoria will send an e-mail blast encouraging members to volunteer for vacant positions.

Secretary: Shari K offered to develop a survey of the membership to determine the interests of the membership and their participation in the PQG.

Treasurer: Marilyn F provided a report of taxable income for the state fiscal year that ended June 30, 2024. The Opportunity Quilt generated funds at the Marin-Sonoma fair.

The Project provides support services, including a basket of basic needs for day-to-day living (shampoo, laundry soap, etc.). Our quilts and pillowcases are added to each basket. The monthly report for the first half of July shows that residents of the homeless shelter received 8 quilts and pillowcases. Blue for stars (1) $4-1/2" \times 4-1/2"$ square (2) $4-7/8" \times 4-7/8"$ squares



Red for corners (2) $4-7/8" \times 4-7/8"$ squares White for background (4) $4-7/8" \times 4-7/8"$ squares

For the 12" x 12" Friendship Star Quilt Block

- 1. Draw a diagonal line, from one corner to the opposite corner, on the reverse side of all light neutral squares.
- 2. Use the quick pieced half-square triangle method to sew a light square to each blue print square of the same size. When complete, each of the four half-square triangle units should measure 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" for a 12" (finished size) quilt block. Set aside.
- 3. Make four more half square triangle units by pairing the remaining 4-7/8" x 4-7/8" light squares with the multicolored squares (for the block's corner triangles) of the same size.
- 4. Arrange the half square triangle units and the 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" blue print square into three rows. Units made with the blue fabric from the stars, and the multicolor print triangle units are used in block corners. Check to make sure the angles of all patches match the diagram.
- 5. Sew the units in each row together. Press seam allowances in the top and bottom rows towards the outer units. Press seam allowances in the center row towards the solid square Sew rows together, carefully matching patch edges and seam intersections.
- 6. Press. The quilt block should measure $12-1/2" \times 12-1/2"$.

Thank you for making this block for a military veterans quilt.

Bowtie

Block of the Month


The bowtie is a versatile block that is fun to lay out in multiple ways, similar to the log cabin. The grouping makes the pattern. I encourage you to make more than one block!

Background provided: 2 – 3-1/2" squares


You provide (think bright):


2-3-1/2" squares

2-1-3/4" squares



Take the 1-3/4" squares draw a corner to corner line and attach this small square to the lower corner of one of the background squares. Sew the small square to the background square along the line and trim off the excess. Put the four squares together as shown below.


