Block of the Month

NORWAY PINE

June 2024 Block of the Month. Questions to Melissa 707 592-3768

Funny note: I chose this block because I thought Arbor Day was in June – it's not. It is April 26th annually.

Attached – background fabric and paper piecing hack for half square triangle (HST) You provide – green fabric for the tree

Cut from the background:

- 1 4.5" square cut into HST
- 2 2.5" squares

Use the rest for the paper piecing of 14 HSTs

Cut from your green


1 HST 6-7/8" on each right angle side


1 rectangle 1-7/8" x 5"

A piece the size of the paper for the paper pieced HSTs


Directions: put the background and green together (right sides together) with the paper for paper piecing. Stitch along the broken lines and when done cut on solid lines. Press open.

Put together as in photo below.





Trim excess fabric.
