

PETALUMA QUILT GUILD BLOCK of the MONTH October 2025

Leaf Block

This month we will be making a Leaf Block. I'm getting this idea from "SCRAP QUILTS the Art of Making Do" by Roberta Horton. I'm supplying the plaid fabric that you can use as the background or any part of the leaves. Use the plaid fabric and two of your fabric to complete the block plus something for the stem.

Cut the following for the leaf:

1. Two 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares

2. One 5-1/2" square

3. One strip 1-1/4" x 8" for stem

Cut the following for the background: 1. Two 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares

2. One 3" x 3" square


3. One 5-1/2 square

Step 1: Match 3-1/2" background and leaf, right sides together and draw a line on the diagonal. Sew 1/4" on both sides of the line. Cut apart on line and press towards the darker fabric. You will have 4 half squares triangles that should measure 3" x 3".


Step 2: The stem. Take the 5-1/2 background fabric, cut on the diagonal and sew the stem fabric right sides together along the diagonal side of the background fabric. Do the same with the other side. Press towards the stem.

Step 3. Lay out the pieces and sew together.



Block will be 8" X 8" unfinished.
